2026 MS4 General Permit (OHQ000005) Review

Part I.A

- **There are currently several MS4s that do not meet the population of 50,000 or more requirement. If the urbanized area designation goes away, how are the regulated areas delineated?**

Part I.B.2

- **Are we currently eliminating “Phase 1” and “Phase 2” language and just saying “small” and “large” communities?**

Part III.B.1.c.ii

- **This new language around salt storage is improved from the proposed ESO language and is more manageable for MS4s. There was concern about contacting contractors who plow and salt residential properties.**

Part IV

- **Construction and Industrial stormwater pollution prevention plans are the same and utilizing different acronyms for each one is unnecessary and could cause confusion.**

Appendix A

- **There needs to be consistency with the use of acronyms vs spelling out the words. Ex. TSS vs dissolved solids.**
- **Benzo(a) pyrene and Dieldrin are legacy pollutants that MS4s cannot directly address. Based on the lack of guidance, we believe these should be removed from the permit.**
