Subject: TRANSPORTATION COUNCIL REPORT - JUNE 7, 2023 MEETING

This report is an update of staff activity and background on selected agenda items for our next Transportation Council meeting to be held on Wednesday, June 7, 2023. Congestion Management Process (CMP) Report (Agenda IV – for approval) – As the population in the Toledo Urbanized Area (TMA) exceeds 200,000, our region is subject to the planning requirements that apply to TMAs including the development and implementation of a Congestion Management Process (CMP). Over the past several months, staff has been preparing a CMP report and presented an update to the System Performance and Performance Committee on April 17th and to the Transportation Planning Committee on May 16th. The Congestion Management Process is intended to provide decision-makers with the following:

- 1) a status on the transportation system congestion
- 2) an understanding of existing and anticipated system performances
- 3) information on congestion management strategies
- 4) specific performance measures
- 5) recommended next steps for implementation

Staff seeks approval of the CMP at this meeting for the document to go to the Board of Trustees on June 21st.

<u>Multimodal Needs Assessment Report (Agenda V – for approval)</u> – Marissa Bechstein will present information on the Multimodal Needs Assessment. The report identifies gaps and needs in the regional transportation system and is used as an information resource in the Long Range Transportation Plan process.

<u>HB 64 Opposition (Agenda VI – For Approval)</u> – Ohio HB 64 as proposed would make broad changes to the state's eminent domain laws. Among the changes are the following:

- Excludes the use of property as a recreational trail as a "public use" for which property may be appropriated.
- Voids appropriations (the taking of property through eminent domain) that do not follow statutorily mandated procedures.
- Increases the taking agency's (the government or private entity appropriating property) burden of proof in appropriation proceedings.
- Narrows factual presumptions made in favor of taking agencies in appropriations proceedings.

- Prohibits a taking agency from reducing any offer it makes in an effort to acquire property, if the attempts may result in appropriations proceedings, or subsequently arguing for a lower valuation in an appropriation proceeding.
- Expands required attorneys' fee, cost, and expense awards due to property owners in appropriation actions.
- Allows property owners who allege their property has been appropriated outside of the required judicial process to sue for inverse condemnation.
- Requires courts hearing inverse condemnation cases to award successful property owners attorneys' fees, costs, and expenses.
- Requires courts hearing appropriations cases to award property owners damages if the taking agency uses coercive actions.
- Lengthens certain appropriation proceeding deadlines.

<u>Vice President's Report (Agenda X – for discussion)</u> – In addition to the above agenda topics and information covered in the Committee Reports, the following are other items members of Transportation Council should be aware of.

- TMACOG will host DriveOhio on Thursday, June 22nd at 11:00 am in the Grand Lobby to hear about progress made thus far and offer feedback on candidate charging locations and other plan updates. The meeting is open to the public. Following the session, a vehicle showcase will begin in the TMACOG parking lot at noon.
- ODOT has informed MPO's statewide that the process to review Urban Area Boundaries will begin during the first week of September of 2023. It is ODOT's goal to have the urban boundary adjustments completed and approved by FHWA by June 30, 2024. Following FHWA approval, the process to update the Ohio Highway Functional Classification system will begin. A target date for approval of the Functional Classification has not yet been determined.
- The OKI Conference on Freight will be held from September 5th 7th in Cincinnati. Featured Keynote Speakers include Jack Marchbanks, Director, Ohio Department of Transportation, and Jim Gray, Secretary, Kentucky Transportation Cabinet.
