- Certification for Inspection and Maintenance of Stormwater Controls Measure in Ohio for 30 people










### Addressing Statewide Problems with Regional Leadership






# Policy Engagement

- 2023-2024 Agenda for Lake Erie Update included refined language for animal industry and TMDL recommendations
- Released the TMACOG Advocacy Toolkit as a companion document to the Agenda for Lake Erie and Transportation Policy Agenda
- Worked with Water Quality Committee Chairs to provide comments during each phase of the Maumee Nutrient TMDL development
