## **Election Cycles and Term Limits**

It can be helpful to know if an elected official is in the middle of their term, ending it, or running for office. This chart gives some information. You can also find term information on the bio page of each elected official.

<sup>\*\*</sup> Michigan State Senate: all seats come up for re-election every four years. There are general election years where no state senate seats are at stake.

## **County Offices Ohio**

All Ohio County officials are elected to 4-year terms in November of even-numbered years. One commissioner and the auditor are elected in the same year as the governor in one cycle; the other two commissioners and the other officials are elected in the same year as the president of the United States.

<sup>\*</sup> Ohio State Senate: staggered elections so that approximately half of state senate seats are up for reelection during the state's general elections that take place every two years. There will be no state-wide elections in Ohio or Michigan in 2021.
