

2022 TMACOG General Assembly School Districts & Colleges/Universities Caucus Monday, April 25, 2022

<u>Call to Order/Welcome</u> – The School Districts and Colleges/Universities Caucus met on Monday, April 25, 2022, at 8:15 a.m. in Parlor B at the Hilton Garden Inn in Perrysburg, Ohio. Cindy Miller, director of grants and strategic initiatives at Lourdes University, called the meeting to order and welcomed everyone present. She explained the purpose of the caucus for anyone who may be new to TMACOG.

Discussion Topics – The following topics were discussed by the caucus.

2022 General Assembly Public School Districts and Colleges/Universities Caucus

• Coming back from COVID...moving on, again

- Attendees acknowledged the development of some beneficial new efficiencies and pedagogies that were developed in response to the pandemic.
- o Some concerns that were expressed regarding education post-pandemic included:
 - Decrease in people who go directly from high school to college
 - Increase in turnover and low interest in entering the education field, especially at the K-12 level
 - Pool of substitute teachers is very small for all capacities
 - Aspects that students have missed for the last two years, such as socialization, will need to be dealt with for at least the next 5 years
 - Mental health is a major concern, and the capacity of schools to address this
 is limited
 - Attempts to remedy some of the impacts of the last two years include enhanced mental health/counselling services, success coaches and first year experiences, and more touchpoints to help students stay on track, and engagement of families to support students

• Workforce development

- There is a need for increased cooperation across the state line for employment and training programs
- Programs for employees were discussed, such as Michigan New Jobs, Ohio Works, and Making Ohio
- The Talent Alignment Strategy, a study completed in 2018 by the Toledo Regional Chamber of Commerce, is being updated

Legislation

- Attendees mentioned two pieces of legislation:
 - Ohio House Bill 123: How can this bill help to provide mental health services to students at schools when the students are from neighboring counties?
 - Ohio Senate Bill 166: An incentive program to encourage employers to bring in young people for work-based learning

Action items

- There were several potential action items identified that the caucus could collaborate on:
 - Opportunities around the federal infrastructure bill
 - Opportunities associated with the location of Intel in Ohio
 - Retaining students in the area/attracting those who may return
 - Regional transportation
- Cindy Miller offered to communicate with TMACOG and caucus members to coordinate any work items.

<u>Next Steps</u> – TMACOG staff reviewed notes from the caucus discussion. Ms. Miller and caucus attendees provided input to prepare a brief report for the TMACOG business meeting.

Adjournment – Cindy Miller thanked everyone for attending the caucus and adjourned the meeting.
